00:05:08 17 has gone uncured. According to number eight there is no
00:05:14 18 breach of contract.
00:05:16 19 MR. WISER: Well, it would be B, Mr. Mayor, that
00:05:18 20 it would be terminated, the agreement, which is for any other
00:05:20 21 reason we can terminate with or without cause within 120
00:05:24 22 days.
00:05:24 23 MAYOR HOCKERSMITH: Within?
00:05:28 24 MR. WISER: Within 120 days.
00:05:30 25 MAYOR HOCKERSMITH: And that could be one day or

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00:05:32 1 119 days?
00:05:32 2 MR. WISER: At least 120 days notification prior
00:05:36 3 to termination.
00:05:42 4 COUNCILWOMAN COY: So you have to give them four
00:05:48 5 months notice before you --
00:05:50 6 COUNCILWOMAN BURROWS: The B is the catchall
00:05:50 7 clause, Mayor.
00:05:50 8 MAYOR HOCKERSMITH: I understand that, but then it
00:05:54 9 takes 120 days to get out of this?
00:05:58 10 MR. WISER: Yes, if they have not breached the
00:06:00 11 agreement.
00:06:00 12 COUNCILWOMAN BURROWS: That also protects us as
00:06:02 13 well.
00:06:04 14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT LAGE: They can't just leave us.
00:06:06 15 COUNCILWOMAN BURROWS: Right.
00:06:08 16 MAYOR HOCKERSMITH: Give and take.
00:06:10 17 MANAGER EPLEY: It could take us four months to get
00:06:12 18 another ambulance service in place. That's a good buffer for
00:06:14 19 us.
00:06:18 20 MR. WISER: I'm sorry, Kathy.
00:06:20 21 COUNCILWOMAN COY: That's okay, go ahead.
00:06:22 22 MR. WISER: The effort was not to renegotiate the
00:06:24 23 current agreement that we have with them but contains
00:06:28 24 substantially similar provisions but to incorporate in the
00:06:30 25 ALS provisions as well as the workers comp provisions, so we

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00:07:40 1 down the road if there's an issue nobody is going to know
00:07:44 2 about this.
00:07:44 3 COUNCILMAN HOCKERSMITH: The mayor will still be
00:07:46 4 here.
00:07:46 5 COUNCILWOMAN COY: So my thought is that we should
00:07:50 6 maybe just review it again in four years or six years.
00:07:58 7 COUNCILMAN HOCKERSMITH: When it comes up for --
00:07:58 8 review it, I mean.
00:08:00 9 COUNCILWOMAN COY: Well, or at least just be
00:08:02 10 acknowledged that it's going to be renewed.
00:08:02 11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT LAGE: That's our responsibility
00:08:04 12 to look at it.
00:08:06 13 COUNCILMAN HOCKERSMITH: My question is have we had
00:08:08 14 any problems.
00:08:10 15 COUNCILWOMAN COY: No, I have no problem with any
00:08:12 16 of this at all, none at all.
00:08:14 17 COUNCILWOMAN BURROWS: They have been stellar.
00:08:16 18 COUNCILMAN HOCKERSMITH: That's what I thought so I
00:08:16 19 guess I'm wondering why there seems to be some angst.
00:08:20 20 COUNCILWOMAN COY: I have absolutely no concerns
00:08:20 21 with what's being provided. My question is the contracts --
00:08:22 22 all contracts. I was just thinking that we were going to
00:08:26 23 review contracts and kind of get away from the renewal
00:08:30 24 contracts, not necessarily every two years.
00:08:32 25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT LAGE: Well, my impression is we

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4 1 didn't comprehensively renegotiate the terms of the agreement
00:06:38 2 which is why a lot of these were made no changes.
00:06:42 3 MAYOR HOCKERSMITH: That's why I read it this time
00:06:44 4 and not the last time.
00:06:46 5 COUNCILWOMAN COY: My only question was that this
00:06:48 6 is continued for a two year term and automatically renews and
00:06:52 7 I thought we were kind of trying to get away from the
00:06:56 8 automatic renewal because of the issues that we've had with
00:06:58 9 contracts. Am I correct on that?
00:07:00 10 MR. WISER: I think it depends on which contracts
00:07:02 11 we're referring to. There are some contracts that are to our
00:07:06 12 benefit for an automatic renewal time period, others that we
00:07:10 13 wanted to remove that provision for various reasons.
00:07:12 14 COUNCILWOMAN BURROWS: I actually kind of agree
00:07:14 15 with Kathy. I don't necessarily know if there's any such
00:07:16 16 contract that we should put on automatic renewal because in
00:07:20 17 two years a lot can change.
00:07:22 18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT LAGE: But you have the right to
00:07:24 19 give notice.
00:07:24 20 COUNCILMAN HOCKERSMITH: Right.
00:07:26 21 COUNCILWOMAN BURROWS: It wouldn't necessarily be
00:07:28 22 brought to our attention unless the contract is in front of
00:07:32 23 us. That's my point.
00:07:34 24 COUNCILWOMAN COY: What my concern is -- my only
00:07:34 25 concern is we're here on four year assignments, so six years

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00:08:34 1 were going to review them all and have them on schedule but
00:08:38 2 not necessarily take out the clause of automatic renewal.
00:08:40 3 COUNCILWOMAN COY: That's fine as long as it's put
00:08:44 4 on a review. I just think we need to keep track of them.
00:08:46 5 That's all.
00:08:46 6 COUNCILMAN HOCKERSMITH: So that just needs to be
00:08:48 7 punched in to a calendar somewhere.

00:08:56 13 COUNCILWOMAN BURROWS: Not only within us but also
00:08:58 14 within all volunteer ambulance company too.
00:09:02 15 COUNCILWOMAN COY: We just don't want things lost
00:09:04 16 over the next couple of years or whatever. That's all.
00:09:10 17 COUNCILWOMAN BURROWS: Some of them are paid but a
00:09:10 18 lot them are volunteer.
00:09:12 19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT LAGE: So I think as long as we
00:09:14 20 have the directive to the manager that we do wish to review
00:09:18 21 contracts.
00:09:20 22 MANAGER EPLEY: We can make sure that that's put --
00:09:22 23 that will remind us.
00:09:24 24 COUNCILWOMAN COY: That was my only concern. I
00:09:26 25 have nothing -- I have no problem with the renewal. It's

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00:09:32 1 just that I didn't want to lose sight of the contract being
00:09:34 2 put on to some type of --
00:09:36 3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT LAGE: And that's a good point.

00:10:36 22 COUNCILMAN HOCKERSMITH: Have they entered in to an
00:10:38 23 agreement with any third party providers to cover us?

00:13:08 25 with Penelec. We are discussing the option of LED lighting,

00:11:18 13 full-time park and rec director was seriously injured at the
00:11:22 14 beginning of summer. She still is not able to return to
00:11:24 15 work. Her next go around with where she stands with her
00:11:30 16 health is the 10th of this month, so we have to extend Tyler
00:11:34 17 Fairchild's employment until the 15th which is our next
00:11:40 18 meeting, so hopefully by that time we will know whether or
00:11:44 19 not Tyler will remain as our temporary part-time -- park and
00:11:48 20 rec director or if our full-time regular park director will
00:11:52 21 be able to return, so this merely is just an extension of the
00:11:56 22 other three resolutions we've done over the summer.
00:12:02 23 COUNCILWOMAN COY: I'll make a motion to adopt the
00:12:02 24 resolution No. 15-024.
00:12:08 25 COUNCILMAN ALOSI: I'll second it.

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00:13:12 1 although it's not just so easy to say we're going to put up
00:13:18 2 LED lighting. We are looking in to the possibility of having
00:13:20 3 to consult with a lighting engineer to determine. The
00:13:28 4 different wattage of these LED lights are sometimes not quite
00:13:34 5 -- what you have out there at this point. They do have --
00:13:36 6 Penelec does have this program. It looks like it's something
00:13:40 7 we certainly would like to pursue. They only carry one cobra
00:13:46 8 head type LED light and that's the issue where we would have
00:13:50 9 to actually see the lights in operation to determine what
00:13:54 10 they're compared to as to what we have throughout the
00:13:56 11 borough, so she has informed us, the lady we spoke to that
00:14:04 12 she is going to have another person from her company contact
00:14:06 13 us so that Kevin and I can go out and see the lights actually
00:14:12 14 in place in the dark so we can see but it's a good program.
00:14:18 15 Some of the lights may not be as cost savings as
00:14:22 16 what you would think based on the amount of lights that you
00:14:26 17 would have to have and the amount of electricity. Some are
00:14:30 18 of them are almost identical to -- comparable to what we have
00:14:34 19 out there now, but based on the sheer volume of lights,
00:14:38 20 several hundred over a year's time it would definitely -- if
00:14:42 21 the lights are able to produce what we have now or better --
00:14:46 22 we certainly don't want to put 300 dimly lit LED lights up
00:14:50 23 that defeat the whole purpose of street lighting so we're
00:14:54 24 waiting to be contacted. We would be paying the costs. They
00:14:58 25 didn't come out and say it but we believe that the cost would

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00:15:06 1 be theirs to purchase the light and install it and then we
00:15:12 2 would have the rental agreement that we have now for we pay a
00:15:16 3 certain amount per light throughout the borough so it's in
00:15:22 4 play to answer your question.
00:15:22 5 MAYOR HOCKERSMITH: Okay. Just to follow-up. Do
00:15:32 6 you know if Penelec has any specific plan once they install
00:15:38 7 street lighting system for ultimate replacement of it. For
00:15:40 8 instance, the streetlights that we have now certainly have
00:15:48 9 been in place close to 35, 40 years. You know, do we just
00:15:52 10 keep them forever or, I mean, I've been through like three,
00:15:56 11 four streetlights light changes over my lifetime.
00:15:58 12 MANAGER EPLEY: Right.
00:15:58 13 MAYOR HOCKERSMITH: Okay, so I'm over three
00:15:58 14 quarters of a century, so we're talking about every 25 years,
00:16:04 15 you know, something like that, so do they have a plan every
00:16:10 16 so many years to upgrade their lighting?
00:16:16 17 MANAGER EPLEY: To answer your questions they're
00:16:16 18 not even pushing this program, and they don't even want to
00:16:22 19 advertise that they have this available because they feel at
00:16:26 20 this point it's so new to them that if everybody started
00:16:32 21 asking for LED lighting it would be so overwhelming, but we
00:16:36 22 are the first to contact them about LED lighting.
00:16:38 23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT LAGE: We would be happy to be a
00:16:40 24 pilot if it will help us save money.
00:16:42 25 MANAGER EPLEY: We tried to play that card with

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00:17:52 1 you have the cars coming up and then you have cars parking
00:17:56 2 and then you had a tractor trailer trying -- and there were
00:17:58 3 several of them come down and went from the turnpike I guess
00:18:00 4 down for the detour. It just seems like we -- it's really
00:18:06 5 narrow. I think we should make that street one way at least
00:18:10 6 Corn Festival day, make that one way the whole way down to
00:18:14 7 Roxbury Road. I know it's narrow down there too.
00:18:18 8 COUNCILWOMAN BURROWS: It almost seems like it
00:18:20 9 would make more sense to make it no parking if it's just for
00:18:22 10 one day.
00:18:24 11 COUNCILWOMAN COY: But I think they need to look at
00:18:26 12 the Burd Street from Earl Street down to Roxbury Road.
00:18:28 13 MANAGER EPLEY: I know Chief Scott and Kevin were
00:18:34 14 speaking about that here yesterday about the tractor
00:18:36 15 trailers.
00:18:36 16 COUNCILWOMAN COY: I'm surprised we didn't lose
00:18:36 17 some poles. We have lost roofs off the houses before. And
00:18:44 18 then the only other thing I was going to ask if maybe Council
00:18:48 19 would -- the borough would send a letter of congratulations
00:18:52 20 to the Red Land team for their U.S. Baseball World Series.
00:18:58 21 COUNCILMAN HOCKERSMITH: I think that would be
00:19:00 22 nice.
00:19:02 23 COUNCILWOMAN COY: I think that would be able to
00:19:02 24 recognize them as a municipality.
00:19:04 25 COUNCILWOMAN BURROWS: It's pretty special for it

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00:16:48 1 them, work with us. You can take all the pictures you like.
00:16:48 2 We'll see.
00:16:50 3 MAYOR HOCKERSMITH: Are you dealing with Beverly

00:17:24 16 of to do.
00:17:26 17 MANAGER EPLEY: What Rebecca Yearick was speaking
00:17:28 18 about?
00:17:28 19 COUNCILWOMAN COY: Yes. And the other thing is and
00:17:30 20 I'm not really sure that this is where it needs to come but
00:17:32 21 maybe we could do the feedback from the borough.
00:17:38 22 On Corn Festival day the tractor trailers that were
00:17:40 23 turning off Earl Street down Burd on that on two-way street
00:17:40 24 was very treacherous, so if they could avoid the parking on
00:17:50 25 Burd Street that day and maybe just make that one way because
