

REQUIREMENTS FOR PERSONAL RECREATIONAL FIRES

❖ **Charcoal Burners** and other open-flame cooking devices

- a. Used on private property for the purpose of cooking foods.
- b. No burning of trash, yard waste, rubbish or domestic refuse or construction material.
- c. Shall not be operated **within 10 feet** of any structure/construction.
- d. Shall be used for outside only **NOT** on balconies, covered porches/decks or any other enclosed areas: i.e., garages

❖ **Chimineas and factory-built novelty stoves**

- a. Must be enclosed by a screen lid, door, or dome cover.
- b. **No** burning of trash, yard waste, rubbish or domestic refuse or construction material.
- c. If smoke, ash or smell emitting from such outdoor chimineas or factory built stoves becomes offensive to neighboring properties enforcement action may be taken.
- d. Shall not be operated **within 15 feet** of any structure/construction or combustible material.

❖ **Recreational Fires**

- a. No burning of trash, yard waste, rubbish or domestic refuse or construction material.
- b. Shall not **exceed** a size of **3 ft. in diameter** on the ground and **2 ft.** in height.
- c. Shall be contained within a fire pit or ring made of non-combustible material or in an outdoor fireplace.
- d. Shall not be conducted **within 25 feet** of any structure/construction or combustible material.

❖ **Bonfires**

- a. No burning of trash, yard waste, rubbish or domestic refuse or construction material.
- b. Shall be conducted with the conditions of obtaining an **OUTDOOR FIRE PERMIT** issued by the Borough of Shippensburg.
- c. Shall not be conducted **within 50 feet** of any structure/construction.

REQUIREMENTS FOR PERSONAL RECREATIONAL FIRES

1. All outdoor recreational fires must be self-contained.
2. All outdoor fire pits, fire pots, fire rings, fire bowls, chimineas, must be enclosed by a screen lid, door, or dome cover.
3. No burning from 12:00 a.m. - 6:00 a.m.
4. Fire must be of wood or charcoal, absolutely NO paper.
5. No fires permitted on porch or balconies of any dwellings.
6. Fire must be completely extinguished at the end of the event.
7. Permit holder is solely responsible for injury or damage caused by fire and must be present with a copy of the permit available for review by police or fire department officials.
8. Fire or Police representatives may order the fire to be extinguished if determined it is in violation of permit, health and safety concerns, or at his/her discretion.
